I Believe in Jesus Christ None Are Cast Aside

AS WE GATHER

The African American spiritual "Give Me Jesus" begins "In the morning when I rise, Give me Jesus," words that remind us that our Savior, Jesus, is with us at all times. The same truth is expressed in another hymn in which English hymnist Timothy Dudley-Smith writes: "Christ be my Leader by night as by day; Safe through the darkness, for He is the way." Jesus Christ, whom we confess in the Creed, is always there to comfort and to guide us. Our songs of praise, whether new to us or old favorites, can well express our thanksgiving for His loving care. The earthly ministry of Jesus was for the most part in a restricted geographical area. For the three years of His public work, He traveled in the area of Judea and Galilee with a singular sojourn through Samaria. But at least on one occasion, He went beyond familiar boundaries north to the district of Tyre and Sidon, in what today is Lebanon. There He brought healing for the daughter of a Canaanite woman, a person seen as a Gentile and an inferior by the Jews of His home area. The love of Jesus broke down barriers and reached across divides. As people who have been sought out by Jesus, we seek ways to extend His love as the Holy Spirit works in and through us.

O Christ our Lord, as the Canaanite woman brought her daughter's need to you, overcoming stigma and rejection to do so, confident of your healing in her life, we bring our needs and the needs of others in prayer. With open arms You welcome all who call on Your name—who acknowledge You as Lord, and look to You in faith. No one stands outside the circle of Your mercy and love. And so, we come to offer You our worship—to declare that You are our God, and that we are Your people, called and chosen by You from the very beginning. Through the presence of Your Holy Spirit open our eyes to see You here; open our minds to receive Your truth, and our mouths to speak and sing Your praise. Come now, Holy Spirit. Let our worship rejoice in you, and lift our hearts, and bind us in one family of loving grace. For You alone are God—worthy of all praise and worship, now and to the end of time. Amen.

WELCOME TO GOD'S HOUSECome and worship, all you who love and serve the Lord—outsiders and insiders, old-timers and new-comers, the young, old and the in-between. Come as you are, for this is God's house—a house of prayer for all people, and God welcomes each one who comes. May we be renewed in the refreshing Spirit of the living Christ. May your burdens be lifted; may you feel comforted and peace as the Lord reveals His plan and purpose in your lives. Let's worship God together! Welcome!

OPENING SENTENCES

Pastor: We have begun our worship in the name of the Father and of the Son and of

the Holy Spirit. Let us speak together the words of the Apostles' Creed

regarding the Second Person of the Holy Trinity.

People: And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the

Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to

judge the living and the dead.

Pastor: What does this mean?

People: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from

eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord,

who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not

with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His

innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to

all eternity. This is most certainly true.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Pastor: It is good and right that we should make confession of our sins. The section

on confession in the Small Catechism informs and directs us with these

words, which summarizes it well.

People: Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second,

that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are

forgiven before God in heaven.

Pastor: Humble yourselves then before God, confess your sins to Him, and implore

His forgiveness.

People: O almighty God, merciful Father, I, a troubled and penitent sinner,

confess to You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your present and eternal

punishment. By nature, I am a sinful creature. By thought, word, and deed, I have continually transgressed Your Law. For the sake of the sufferings and death of Your Son. Jesus Christ, be gracious and

merciful to me, a penitent and contrite being. Forgive me all of my sins, and grant me the power of Your Holy Spirit that I may amend my sinful

life.

Pastor: God be gracious to you and strengthen your faith.

People: Amen.

Pastor: As you believe, so let it be. As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by

His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father

and of the

■ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.
